MALGA JURIBELLO




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description

UNESCO Dolomites system	Pale di San Martino, San Lucano, Dolomiti Bellunesi, Vette Feltrine
mountain group(s)	Pale di San Martino
UNESCO values	<p>Landscape: the stunning plateau of Malga Juribello and its pastures stretches for about 180 hectares in the Paneveggio-Pale di San Martino Natural Park. It is a magnificent example of traditional mountain pastureland which has come about thanks to the positive interaction between man and nature over the course of the centuries. The importance of the flora, fauna and biodiversity here is linked in equal measure to the fertility of the soil and man's intervention over the centuries to cultivate it. The landscape is also of cultural interest as there is a publicly-owned experimental dairy (it belongs to the Autonomous Province of Trento) which is run by the Federazione Provinciale Allevatori for productive and educational purposes. As regards the structural values of the landscape, in this area (the plateau and Rolle Pass) there are many examples of the contrast between the dark deposits of volcanic origin and the impressive light limestone walls which give the Dolomites their typical colour all year round.</p> <p>Geology: the stratigraphic sequence in this section covers a period of about 150 million years, from the early Palaeozoic to the late Carnian/Norian periods. Most of its rocks belong to the Permian-Triassic eras, with a large percentage from the Anisian-Ladinian period.</p> <p>In this area (Venegia Pass, Valles Pass, Rolle Pass), there are outcrops of rock that tell of the arrival of the first Dolomite sea, starting from the Athesian volcanic events and the gradual erosion of the ancient Hercynian mountains.</p>

	<p>The Triassic period of volcanic activity, which involved the whole area, meant that the original geometries of a large Ladinian island (island-deep sea; island-volcanic material) have been preserved, providing us with a “cast” of what the geography looked like at the time.</p> <p>[source: www.dolomitiunesco.info]</p>
description of the route	<p>The beginning of the route to Malga Juribello (46.300184, 11.763577) is along main road SS50, which climbs from Predazzo to the Rolle Pass, at the fourth bend after the village of Paneveggio. A short distance after the turn-off, on the right, is a free untarmacked car park and a grassy picnic area (46.299521, 11.763816). This area gives pedestrian access to the road to Malga Juribello, which is well-signposted. Follow the forest road, which is closed to traffic, and after about 2.5 km you will get to Malga Juribello. The route is flat and starts off in the woods. At about halfway there is an observation point with a small wooden panoramic terrace which overlooks the Travignolo Valley, giving a lovely view of Paneveggio Lake. After the first kilometre and a half, when you meet two bridges (junction in the forest for Malga Pian dei Casoni), follow the sign and turn right. Here there is a rest area with picnic tables and information boards. For the final 900 metres, the route comes out of the wood and opens up onto the vast pastures surrounding the dairy. It continues to climb but the terrain is always even and well packed. You return the same way you came.</p>
advice	
recommended period	Mid-June to end of September (when the dairy is open). July and August are particularly busy times: you may have problems finding somewhere to park.
recommended gear	Wear layers and comfortable boots. It is important to have sunscreen with you at all times, a change of clothes should it rain, a small first aid kit, something to eat and drink along the way.
recommended equipment	The well packed, fine gravel terrain and the gentle slopes make this route suitable for hiking pushchairs and outdoor wheelchairs (even push models), except for the final hundred or so metres uphill where you will need a little help. When on your own, it is advisable to have means which are more practical on uneven terrain (electric wheelchair with a front wheel or off-road all-wheel drive).
recommendations	Always travel with others, so they can help you deal with any difficulties you may encounter. When following the itinerary in a wheelchair, on a mountain bike or with a pushchair, fit tyres with deep treads and always carry a complete tyre repair kit with a pump and spare inner tube.

terrain	Terrain is even (fine stabilised gravel)
obstacles	Some narrow channels cross the path (but do not create any particular problems for electric wheelchairs or wheelchairs with a front wheel); barrier at the beginning (room to get around it, is normally open)

access	<u>Public transport:</u> Trentino Trasporti bus (not equipped for carrying wheelchairs. Times: www.ttesercizio.it) <u>Private transport:</u> free car park at the beginning of the route
restrictions	The forest road is closed to traffic. It is possible to reach the dairy by car if displaying your disabled badge (with one person accompanying only)
car park	Free car park with no reserved spaces. At busy times of the year it is difficult to find a space. There is a secondary car park a little further on. The two car parks have space for a total of about 30 cars.
accessible toilets	Malga Juribello (bathroom also accessible for electric wheelchairs)
refreshments	Malga Juribello (refreshments available and dairy products for sale)
recharging stations for electric bikes	None
network coverage	Coverage in the whole area is good
