


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ITINERARY 4A

ZEMOLA VALLEY - CAVA BUSCADA



UNESCO Dolomites system	Dolomiti Friulane
mountain group(s)	Duranno
UNESCO values	Landscape: the Zemola Valley lies to the north of the village of Erto and it nature and landscape, which are still largely untouched, are of great importance. The valley is dominated all around by the steep walls of the group of Mount Duranno which, standing at 2652 m a.s.l., is the highest peat in the Dolomiti Friulane Park and one of the most imposing in the region. The landscape is typical of high-altitude grazing land, with meadows and hat pastures. Shepherds' houses and dairies (which were used collectively) hav been renovated and are still used and there are also the remains of old house once inhabited by woodcutters and charcoal burners. Today the old quarry where red limestone rich in ammonite ("Ramello Rosso Ammonitico") wa extracted, can be visited to learn more about this open-air museum. The ol quarriers' house is a reminder of its mining past, when everything was done b hand, and it has been renovated and turned into a mountain hut (Cav Buscada). There is a great variety of flowers in the valley, with examples of more unusual species like the martagon lily, the orange lily, gymnadenia an edelweiss, testimony to the pristine natural environment. Geology : this area is of great interest for reconstructing the Quaternar evolution of the Dolomites since it contains deposits from glacial lake outwash plains, known as sandurs and other well preserved deposits from the late glacial age. The Jurassic deposits from the sea that is generally very dee (the Soverzene, Igne, Vajont, Fonzaso and Rosso Ammonitico formations) ar



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	mainly calcareous rock and make up the Dof-Najarda area, the area to the west of Cimolais, the Cellina summit and the upper part of the Raut massif. [source: www.dolomitiunesco.info]
description of the route	This excursion is challenging due to its length (almost 5 km) and difference in height (just under 600 m) but it is very scenic and has many features of natural, historical and cultural interest. From the village of Erto, drive along the scenic road leading to the Zemola Valley which is tarmacked at the beginning and then becomes a dirt road. Leave your car in the car park at Casera Mela. The itinerary begins here, along a fairly steep dirt track (average incline of 12%). Along the route you will see a lot of interesting evidence of the quarrying which took place in this area in the past (Rosso Ammonitico limestone quarry). The route continues through beautiful beech woods and then, where the trees end, opens up onto the farreaching panorama of the Vajont Valley. Here there is a lovely view over Mount Duranno and the folds of the Mount Porgeit fault, as well as the huge Vajont Valley as far as the Monte Col Nudo chain. Go through the short tunnel to the Cava Buscada mountain hut, the end of the route. Along the dirt road, about 200 m before getting to the hut, there is a short climb to the archaeological site of the old Rosso Ammonitico marble quarry (4A Buscada Cava marmo.gpx).

recommended period	From spring to autumn when the mountain hut is open (every day in the summer; weekends the other times of the year). info: https://www.cavabuscada.com/
recommended gear	Clothing suitable for the mountains, an anorak in case the weather suddenly changes and a change of clothes (T-shirt and socks), hiking boots and poles, sunscreen and sunglasses, food and water, binoculars to watch the wildlife (marmots).
recommended equipment	Due to the condition of the terrain, we recommend hiking (electric off-road chairs) or Joëlette wheelchairs. Given the distance, when using an electric wheelchair, it is a good idea to take some spare batteries.
recommendations	Always travel with others, so they can help you deal with any difficulties you may encounter. When following the itinerary in a wheelchair, on a mountain bike or with a pushchair, fit tyres with deep treads and always carry a complete tyre repair kit with a pump and spare inner tube.
N.B.	Road closed to traffic. Customers of the mountain hut, however, may use their own vehicles (with off-road all-wheel drive).
